Event Purpose

In Ishigaki Island, a gateway to Asia from Japan, junior sailors from both Japan and abroad will come together to compete in sailing skills and seamanship they have honed through daily practice. Through this competition and international exchange, we hope to broaden the horizons of both local and international junior sailors, providing them with an opportunity to grow into world-class athletes.

Dates: January 3, 2026 (Saturday) to January 5, 2026 (Monday)

Venue: Painuhama Beach, Ishigaki City, Okinawa

Race Type: Optimist Dinghy (OP Class)

Organizers: Okinawa Sailing Federation, Ishigaki Marine Youth Association, and Ishigaki Junior Yacht Club.

Cooperation: Japan Junior Yacht Club Federation ,Fukuoka Sailing Federation, and Kyushu Watersports Management Association

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2025–2028 (hereinafter referred to as "RRS").
- 1.2 The current Optimist Class Rules shall apply.
- 1.3 RRS 60.2(a) is amended as follows:"A boat intending to protest shall inform the race committee boat located at the finish line of the boat being protested immediately after finishing."
- 1.4 Appendix P of the RRS will apply for breaches of RRS 42.

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1 According to WS Advertising Regulation 20.3.2, competitors are allowed to display advertising on their hulls, but it is restricted by Class Rule 2.8.
- 2.2 Boats may be required to display event advertising selected and provided by the organizing authority.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 Competitors must be under the age of 16.
- 3.2 Competitors must be registered members of the Japan Sailing Federation (JSAF) for the 2024 fiscal year. This requirement does not apply to overseas competitors.
- 3.3 Competitors must be listed in the 2025 roster of junior yacht clubs registered with JJYU.
- 3.4 Competitors who have participated in the 2025 East-West Optimist Class Sailing Championships (A Class).
- 3.5 Competitors approved by the Organizing Authority. In principle, each club is limited to a maximum of two participants. However, this restriction does not apply if participants bring their own boats.
- 3.6 Overseas competitors approved by the Organizing Authority.

4.Participation Application

- 4.1 Entries must be completed by filling out the application form available on the official event website and by paying the required entry fee. Entry will not be considered complete until payment is confirmed. If a club has more than two participants, the club representative must submit a single consolidated form. Entry fees are non-refundable except under special circumstances. [Online Entry URL]: Details will be provided on the official event website.
- 4.2The entry period will be from September 1, 2025 to November 1, 2025. Entries will be accepted only after full payment of the entry fee. Entry will close once the number of participants reaches 40.
- 4.3 The regatta may be postponed or canceled under the following circumstances: If the venue becomes unavailable due to natural disasters or other unforeseen events. If administrative authorities, facility operators, educational institutions, or the Japan Sailing Federation recommend or instruct cancellation or postponement due to public health concerns, such as the spread of COVID-19 or other infectious diseases.

4.4 If the event is canceled or postponed for reasons outlined in 4.3, a partial refund will be made after deducting necessary administrative costs from the entry fee. The charter fee and deposit will be fully refunded. In this case, for those who have already arranged transportation for using their own boats, a subsidy of JPY 30,000 per boat will be provided (a copy of the invoice or other document proving the transportation arrangement must be submitted).

5. Participation Fee

5.1 Entry Fee

Entry fee per athlete: ¥15,000

5.2 Charter Boats

A total of 20 charter boats will be available on a first-come, first-served basis, with a limit of 2 boats per club.

Manufacturer: Far East

Fee: JPY 40,000 per boat (sails not included)

Damage Deposit: JPY 50,000 per boat

The full deposit will be refunded if no damage is confirmed upon return. Charter requests must be submitted at the time of entry via the official procedure to the Regatta Office. Applications by phone, fax, or other unofficial methods will not be accepted.

5.3 Transportation Subsidy

For sailors bringing their own boats from outside Okinawa Prefecture, a transportation subsidy of JPY 30,000 per boat will be provided. Payment will be made on the final day of the race.

5.4 A subsidy for foreign athlete recruitment expenses (100,000 yen per country) will be provided. However, this applies only to athletes who placed within the top 20 in their national competition. Payment will be made on the final day of the race.

5.5 The participation fee must be paid by the end of the application period. Please write the participant's name in the payer section. If you are paying for multiple participants, email the names of the participants to the event office as a club unit.

6. Race Structure

6.1 The regatta will be conducted as a single fleet, with all boats starting together.

7.1 A total of 7 races are scheduled. A maximum of 4 races will be held per day.

7.2 Lunch may be taken on the water each day.

8. Measurement

- 8.1 Charter boats manufactured by Far East will be provided for hulls (excluding sails) and equipment.

 However, the use of equipment other than the hull is permitted. In such cases, a valid measurement certificate must be submitted at registration. No modifications to fixed equipment on charter boats are allowed.
- 8.2 Competitors bringing their own boats must present a valid measurement certificate at registration.
- 8.3 The race committee may conduct measurements at their discretion.

9.Safety Regulations

- 9.1 Crew members must wear appropriate life jackets from departure until return to shore.
- 9.2 Since the race area becomes shallow enough to stand during low tide, participants are required to wear boots.

10. Sailing Instructions

10.1 The sailing instructions will be available on the official event website from December 1, 2025 onward. No paper copies will be distributed by the organizing committee.

11.Venue

- 11.1 Painuhama Beach, Ishigaki City, Okinawa Prefecture
- 11.2 The race area is indicated in the attached Diagram A.

12.Course

- 12.1 The sailing course shall be one of the following. For details, please refer to the Sailing Instructions.
 - 1) Sausage Course
 - 2) Trapezoid Course

13.Scoring

- 13.1 A total of 7 races are scheduled. The regatta will be valid if at least one race is completed.
- 13.2 If fewer than 4 races are completed, a boat's series score shall be the total of all race scores.
- 13.3 If 4 or more races are completed, a boat's series score shall be the total of all race scores excluding the worst score.

14.Support Boats

- 14.1 Support boats are not permitted.
- 14.2 There will be no spectator boats. Set up a viewing space.

15.Awards

- 15.1 Awards will be presented to top-performing competitors as follows:
- 1) Competitors placing 1st through 6th will receive certificates and commemorative prizes.

The 1st place winner will be awarded the championship trophy.

2)Awards and commemorative gifts will be presented to the top six winners in the U12 (elementary school) category.

16.Risk Statement

- 16.1 By applying for this event, participants are deemed to have pledged the following:
- 16.2 According to RRS 3, "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is solely that of the boat." By participating, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing involves inherent risks and potentially dangerous actions. These risks include strong winds, rough seas, sudden weather changes, equipment failures, errors in boat handling, inexperienced handling by other boats, unstable footing, and increased injury risks due to fatigue. Risks specific to sailing sports include drowning, psychological trauma, hypothermia, and other causes of severe, lasting injury or death.
- 16.3 The organizing authority will not be liable for any physical damage, bodily injury, or death occurring before, during, or after the event. The organizing authority also accepts no responsibility in case of infection by COVID-19 or any other infectious disease.

17.Insurance

17.1 Competitors and supporters must have valid accident insurance during the event.

18.Athlete's Image Rights and Personal Information Disclosure

18.1 By participating in the event, athletes grant the organizing authority and the event committee the right to use videos, still images, and footage related to the athlete or their equipment during the event without compensation.

18.2 Personal information submitted upon entry will not be provided to third parties without the individual's consent, but names, affiliations, sail numbers, school years, and genders may be published in entry lists and results.

Other Information (Additional Information Not Included in the Race Notice)

- 1. To use Okinawa Prefecture Ishigaki Youth Center (https://ishigaki-yh.com/), an application form is available; please apply as a club to the tournament secretariat. Accommodation costs: 410 yen per night for children (elementary and junior high school students), 810 yen per night for adults (an additional 185 yen for sheets is required in addition to the accommodation fee), 600 yen for breakfast, and 800 yen for dinner. A shuttle bus will run from Ishigaki Youth Center to Painuhama Beach every morning and evening from January 3rd to 5th (if there are few participants, the bus will be replaced by a car provided by the organizers).

 For other accommodations, please make your own arrangements. There are many hotels located about a 15-minute walk from the race venue (Painuhama Beach). There is a convenience store nearby.
- 2. Garbage Disposal: No garbage collection service is provided. Generally, Please take all garbage back to your accommodation.
- 3. Reception Participation Fee on January 3, 2026: Reception participants will be charged:

Adults: JPY 6,000 per person

Elementary and junior high school students: JPY 4,000 per person

We will prepare local elementary, junior high, and high school students and other entertainment events.

Applications must be sent by club to the event office using a separate form. Prepayment is required.

- 4. Facilities: Changing rooms and restrooms are available in the management building.
- 5. Shipping destination for brought-in boats: Painuhama Beach, Painuhama Town, Ishigaki City, Okinawa Prefecture. Person in charge at the shipping destination: Hiroshi Maeda, Tel: 090-1875-8682 (They will support receipt and return work.)
- 6. It takes about 25 minutes by car from Ishigaki Airport to the race venue. The race period coincides with the busy tourist season. After confirming the race application, it is recommended to promptly book your airline tickets and hotel accommodations.
- 7. Participants who plan to use their own equipment (spars, etc.) should check with their airline in advance whether it can be transported by air.
